

## Answer: QUIMBY STREET or WASHINGTON STREET

Twelve of the fifteen six-letter words can be fit into two word squares, given below:

That leaves three unused words: search, fossil, and Oregon. These three words in that order actually form instructions; a hint that you should look at a map of Fossil, OR. Doing so, while keeping in mind the fairly obvious vacuum theme of this puzzle, will lead you to find this street:


However, since Dyson is only a moderate idiot, he will not live on Hoover Street itself. Rather, he can be found on either Quimby Street or Washington Street. (He keeps residences on both streets, apparently.)
